ABOUT ME

I was born at Ft. Fitzsimons Military Hospital in Aurora Colorado in 1971 to Winfred Jackson Jr. and Goldie Quinn Jackson. My parents are both Vietnam Veterans. My mother is a proud member of Sisseton Wahpeton Oyate. We returned to the Lake Traverse Reservation when I was 15 after my father retired from the United States Army.

My interest in working for our tribe began at age 16 where I worked at the bingo hall when it was located at the gym in Old Agency. My mother's side of the family had a history of law enforcement, which led me to becoming a Tribal Police Officer. I was blessed to have started the K-9 program for the Tribe. While working with our tribal Law Enforcement I developed a heart for our people, and a desire to do more on a Tribal leadership level.

My grandmother, Lucy Hill taught me to serve our people and be a part of the solutions that are needed for our Tribe. I remember her saying, "Lisa you don't have a right to complain about anything unless you step up and do something about the problem." Her words have remained with me.

I have studied Criminal Justice at United Tribes, Political Science at Black Hills State University, Paralegal Studies at Turtle Mountain College, and graduated from the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center out of Artesia New Mexico.

To me the most valuable education I have received comes from living and working with our people. In my 37 years living here I was privileged to serve our tribe in many different roles.

Besides being a Police Officer, I was a legal assistant to the tribal attorney, budget specialist for Chairman Shepard, Associate Manager at the Magic, General Manager at Connection, Compliance Manager for Dakota Magic, Big Coulee District Chair, Big Coulee's Council Representative, and SWO Vice Chairwoman.
